### **Shifting out of Neutral !**

After the Assembly in Korhogo, we drove to Bouaké for three reasons: to check on Ezechiel, to visit the cell group there and to celebrate Ivoirien Mother's Day on May 30.

Ezechiel has been under treatment since October 5, 2020 for a Buruli Ulcer that had engulfed his whole right arm. When we arrived at the treatment center, we found him in very good spirits. Having finished all the skin grafts, Ezechiel had begun physical therapy to regain use of his hand. We are thrilled that he is moving out of neutral and gearing up to finish his school exams next year. We soon learned why he was so happy as our visit happened to fall on his 21st birthday. We thanked the Lord for Ezechiel and that God had encouraged us to purchase some items for Ezechiel, including a bag of candy to share with others who were in the center for the same treatment. We are so thankful for God's hand of healing on this tall blessed young man!

We spent Mother's Day visiting some of our other "children," students who are part of the new cell group there. And we spent a day at our favorite getaway spot with rescued animals roaming freely, such as the dik-dik below.
